

Capitals given all-clear for re-signing Orpik

ARLINGTON, Va.

The NHL questioned the Washington Capitals about re-signing Brooks Orpik after trading him to Colorado and cleared the Stanley Cup champions of any wrongdoing.

General manager Brian MacLellan said the league questioned the Capitals for trading the veteran defenceman and then bringing him back at a cheaper salary after the Avalanche bought him out. MacLellan said the Capitals were above board in everything they did and would face no consequences.

"They put us through a thorough questioning," MacLellan said Friday. "We did everything above board, and we answered the questions honestly. There was no repercussions, so I think we're good."

In an email to The Associated Press, deputy commissioner Bill Daly confirmed MacLellan's assessment that the league investigated Washington and found nothing to be amiss with Orpik's situation.

At the draft in June, the Capitals traded Orpik and backup goaltender Philipp Grubauer to Colorado for a second-round pick, a move made largely to clear salary-cap space. Avalanche GM Joe Sakic said almost immediately after the trade that he'd be buying out the final season of Orpik's deal that carried a salary of \$4.5 million and a cap hit of \$5.5 million.

Orpik signed with the Capitals about a month later.

Zetterberg retires

DETROIT

Henrik Zetterberg knew something wasn't right with his back last January when he stopped practicing. Despite the aches and pains, he did not miss a game all season for the Detroit Red Wings.

When Zetterberg laced up his skates for the final game of the regular season, he thought that might be the finale of his career. He held out hope over the summer his career could resume and was still clinging to that when he met with a doctor last week.

"Got the final result and nothing really had changed," Zetterberg told reporters Friday in Traverse City, Michigan. "So, that's kind of when it kicked in."

The 37-year-old Zetterberg, who won the Conn Smythe Trophy as the top player in the post-season when the Red Wings hoisted the Stanley Cup in 2008, is calling it a career. The skilful, smooth-skating Swede is a member of a select group of players that has won a Stanley Cup, world championship and Olympic gold.

And now he is done, another blow for a proud franchise that has struggled in recent years.

"Obviously, it is emotional," Zetterberg said. "It's been 15 years here. Even though I knew I was on my last couple years, I wish that I could have played a little bit longer."

Zetterberg will go on long-term injured reserve with three years left on his 12-year, \$73 million contract. He will continue to be paid and the team will get some \$6 million in salary cap relief.

"He's got a degenerative condition in his back," Red Wings general manager Ken Holland said. "Part of the degenerative condition is significant arthritis. Nothing can be done. No back surgery. No rehab. No more time off is going to have any positive impact."

Holland called Zetterberg one of the best players in the long history of the Red Wings and it's hard to argue with that. Zetterberg had 337 goals and 960 career points and regularly was a candidate for the Selke Trophy honouring the NHL's best defensive forward.

Oilers still hope to sign Nurse

Edmonton Oilers general manager Peter Chiarelli says he has a Plan B if contract talks remain at a stalemate with defenceman Darnell Nurse.

Chiarelli addressed that and other issues — ranging from Connor McDavid questions to the Erik Karlsson trade — as the team hit the ice for the first time Friday at training camp.

"We obviously couldn't come to an agreement, but we hope we can get him in camp at some point here shortly," Chiarelli said, referring to Nurse.

Chiarelli declined to go into specifics on Plan B: "We'll cross that bridge when (we) come to it."

The two sides are negotiating a bridge contract coming out of Nurse's entry-level deal.

Nurse's absence, and the off-season torn Achilles tendon to Andrej Sekera, their top puck-moving defender, has left the Oilers thin on the blue line.

WATER MAIN FLUSHING & FIRE HYDRANT INSPECTIONS

Environmental Utilities performs regular, routine maintenance to uphold the water quality and system infrastructure by annually flushing water mains and inspecting fire hydrants.

During these operations, there may be some discoloration in the water which is not harmful to consume and will disappear when flushing is complete. Please note that discoloured water should not be used for laundry and that fluctuating water pressure may also be noticed.
